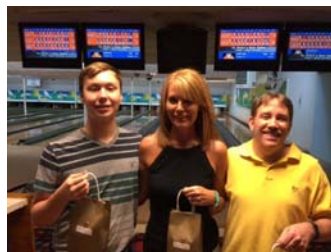

## Bowling Lingo

**Frame-** A single turn for a bowler consisting of one or two rolls, depending on pinfall.

**Mark-** A spare or a strike.

**Clean Game-** A game with strikes or spares in every frame.

**Open Frame-** Any frame in which a strike or spare was not made.

**Perfect Game-** Scoring 300 by getting 12 strikes in a row.

**Sleeper-** Any pin that is located behind another and typically isn’t seen.

**5 Bagger-** Five strikes in a row. Also known as Yahtzee or Dropping the Nickel.

**Turkey-** Three strikes in a row.

## IN THE SPOTLIGHT: TUESDAY NIGHT BOWLING



If it's Tuesday night, then it must be Bowling Night for many folks in the Tri-Cities. It was almost 4 years ago that John Martin and Bart Turner came up with the idea of organizing a bowling night for the church. Originally, they thought it might produce some friendly competition amongst other church groups; instead it became a time for members and friends of Woodlawn Presbyterian Church to enjoy a good social outing while honing a new skill.

Each week from 6:30 to 8:30pm, an average of 10 to 20 people meet at the Hopewell Bowling Center on 15<sup>th</sup> Avenue to bowl, or just give their support as spectators. Small bags of candy are given each week to the adult male, adult female and youth bowler with the "Most Marks".

There is also a Bowling Dinner Party every 13th week, and trophies are awarded to the best bowlers over the past 12 weeks; some surprise trophies, like the "Most Improved", are also given. The Hopewell Bowling Center Management has certainly been hospitable and accommodating. The service is friendly, refreshments are reasonably priced, and so are the games (\$3) and shoe rental (\$3).
